## **Spelling Strategies!**

When practicing with your child, ensure they understand what each word means. Spellings ONLY need a capital letter if there is one on the spelling sheet!

Look, cover, write and check – Look at the word carefully, cover it so you cannot see (no peaking), have a go at writing the word. Did you get it correct? What do you need to work on? Try again!

Segment and blending – Say the word out loud. What sounds can you hear? What graphemes do you know for that sound? Example; goat. First the g sound next the o sound. Which grapheme looks correct? o, oa, ow? Finally, what is the end sound 't'. Now blend together.

Spelling rules – While there are always exceptions to the rules, many of them help us get a good grasp on our spellings. 'Remove the e and add 'ing', Add 'ed for the past tense', 'I

before E except after C'. Knowing and using these rules can be very helpful!

Mnemonics – Use a formula or rhyme to help you remember the spellings. You can use a well-known one; M, I double S, I, double S, I, double P, I. Or try to create your own!
