Easter Bonnet

Make an Easter bonnet using recycled materials. You could ask everyone in your family to make one too and have an Easter bonnet parade!

Easter nests

Make chocolate cornflake cakes and pop a few chocolate eggs in the middle to make them look like nests.

Easter Card



There are lots of fantastic ideas online to choose from. It could be as simple as cutting out an Easter egg shape and decorating it and then sticking it to a piece of folded card. Get creative!

Easter Tree

Find some twigs or small branches and arrange them in a vase or jug. Draw and colour colourful Easter themed pictures and/ or make salt dough Easter shapes (see below) and attach string to them and then hang them on the twigs to make your Easter tree.

Cross

Cut a cross out of paper or card and decorate it however you like. You could use tissue paper, paint, felt tips, crayons or anything else you have at home. Make it colourful and bright!



Salt dough Easter shapes

Mix all the following ingredients to make a dough, roll out and cut out Easter shapes, piercing a hole in the top so you can hang them.

1 cup plain flour (about 250g)

half a cup of table salt (about 125g)

half a cup of water (about 125ml)

You then bake it at 180 for 3 hours. Decorate with paint when cool.



Other Easter Tasks

- Write an **acrostic poem** about Easter. (An acrostic poem is where each line of the poem starts with a letter that makes a word vertically.)
- Write a **riddle** about something Easter related.
- Write an **Easter quiz** for your friends and family to complete. There are lots of Easter facts on this website that you could use:
